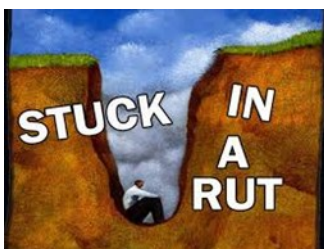

Indianhead Community Action Agency Launches New Program Called 'Safe at Home'.

Often, individuals feel they must give up their independence and move from their homes before they are ready. That is where Safe at Home comes in. Safe at Home can provide the security that you or a loved one may need to live safely in your home for as long as desired. The program helps to make this possible by providing a trained nursing staff to complete two in-home visits. During the first visit, a Registered Nurse can conduct an assessment for risks of falls in your home and recommend home modifications that can help reduce those risks. During the second visit, a nurse can help review your medications and provide educational materials, information and referrals for additional resources if needed.

Following the in-home falls risk assessment, Safe at Home collaborates with ICAA's licensed Weatherization staff to install home modifications such as grab bars, stair railings, smoke detectors, motion lights, or other recommendations identified during your in-home assessment. "These minor modifications may be all you need to have the security and comfort of reducing the risk of falling in your home and help avoid costly emergency medical expenses," says Toni McCutcheon, Safe at Home Director. "We are excited about the possibilities this program holds to help individuals in our communities to thrive and live independently in their own homes."
