## SAFE AT HOME PROGRAM

Aims to provide the security that elders may need to live safely in their homes for as long as desired

This program does this by providing a trained nursing staff to complete two in-home visits. During the first visit a registered nurse conducts an assessment for risks of falls and recommends home modifications that can help reduce the risk. During the second visit, a nurse can help review medications and provide educational materials, information and referrals for additional resources if needed.

Following the in-home assessment, Safe at Home collaborates with ICAA's licensed weatherization staff to install home modifications such as grab bars, stair railings, smoke detectors, motion lights or recommendations identified during the in-home assessment.

These minor modifications may be all you need to have the security and comfort of reducing the risk of falling in your home and help avoid costly emergency medical expenses.

We are excited about the possibilities this program holds to help individuals in our communities to thrive and live independently in their own homes.
