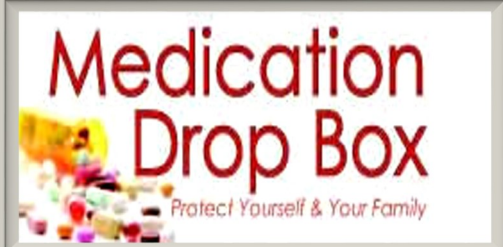

 Launches "Safe at Home"
 Program



Aims to provide the security that elders may need to live safely in their homes for as long as desired

This program does this by providing a train nursing staff to complete two in-home-visits. During the first visit a registered nurse conducts an assessment for risks of falls and recommends home modifications that can help reduce the risk. During the second visit, a nurse can help review medications and provide educational materials, information and referrals for additional resources if needed.

Following the in-home assessment, Safe at Home ,collaborates with ICAA's licensed weatherization staff to install home modifications such as grab bars, stair railings, smoke detectors, motion lights or recommendations identified during the in-home assessment.

These minor modifications may be all you need to have the security and comfort of reducing the risk of falling in your home and help avoid costly emergency medical expenses.

We are excited about the possibilities this program holds to help individuals in our communities to thrive and live independently in their own homes.

USDA funding available

USDA Rural Development has funding available for very low and low-income individuals and families seeking to purchase or repair a home in a rural area.

“Safe, affordable housing and the availability of credit are key to the growth and prosperity of rural communities,” said Dave Schwobe, acting state director. “USDA Rural Housing Programs have provided stability and opportunity for over 60 years and we value what we have accomplished. USDA Rural Development’s Rural Housing Programs offer a broad range of homeownership assistance available to individuals and families who wish to, or currently, live in rural areas, cities and communities. The Rural Housing Program area of USDA Rural Development has the ultimate goal of providing affordable homeownership opportunities to Wisconsin residents.

USDA’s Direct Home Loan Program offers financing to qualified very-low and low income applicants who are unable to qualify for traditional financing. No down payment is required and the interest rate could be as low as one percent with a subsidy. Applicants must meet income and credit guidelines and demonstrate repayment ability. The program is available in rural communities of 20,000 people or less.

The maximum loan amount for repair is \$20,000 at a 1 percent interest rate, repayable for up to 20 years. Grants of up to \$7,500 are available to homeowners 62 and older and must be used to remove health or safety hazards, such as fixing a leaking roof, installing indoor plumbing or replacing a furnace.
